



Sixth Form Dress Code

Students are required to be smartly dressed.

Students should be smartly dressed in professional attire, with identity cards and lanyards worn and visible at all times.

In practice, this means:

- Smart suit or smart trousers/skirt and smart jacket/blazer
- Shirt, smart blouse/shirt or turtle-neck jumper
- Formal shoes

Variations in colours or patterns are permitted but if in doubt, please speak with a member of the Sixth Form team.

*The following are examples of casual clothing that are **not** permitted (this is not an exhaustive list):*

- Casual style dresses (e.g. those with a vest style top, very thin straps and/or strapless style top)
- Jeans/Denim trousers, shirts, blouses or skirts
- Casual trousers (e.g. combats, track suits, leggings)
- Casual tops (e.g. track suit, fleeces, t-shirts, hooded tops, vest tops)
- Shorts
- Sportswear
- Short skirts/revealing clothes
- Trainers
- Hats, caps and bandannas
- Clothing with logos or statements.

In addition, students should appear professional in their image.

This dress code applies to all students from September 2024.
