### **New Year 7 Testing – Saturday 6<sup>th</sup> June 2026**

We are looking forward to meeting our new Year 7 cohort on Saturday 6<sup>th</sup> June for the transition test. The assessments are designed to support a smooth and successful transition into secondary school by helping us build a clear understanding of each student's strengths, abilities, and any areas where additional support may be beneficial from the outset. Alongside Key Stage 2 SATs outcomes and information shared by primary schools, the assessments help us to create well-balanced mixed-ability classes, place students appropriately into Maths sets, and ensure that any necessary support or intervention can be put in place as early as possible.

These are nationally standardised assessments and are completed online. They assess a range of areas including reading, writing, numeracy, and verbal reasoning. The assessments are not something students can revise or prepare for, and we encourage students simply to do their best without any unnecessary worry or pressure.

Should your child have a medical need requiring medication or a medical intervention such as an inhaler or EpiPen, please ensure they bring this with them on the day, and this medical need has been indicated on their medical form sent into the school.

Students need to arrive via the **front gate to the school by 8.50am**. The gate will be open from 8.40am and staff will be there to direct them and welcome them. There are no restrictions on Meadow Rise at the weekend and therefore students can be dropped at the gate by car.

Please collect students from the **front entrance at 12pm**, they will be allowed to make their own way home if you wish.

They do not need to bring anything with them but are permitted to have a bottle of water should they want one, we will provide them with a drink and a snack during the morning.

We are very much looking forward to meeting them and wish them the best of luck for their SATs assessments this week.
